# Lyons Chapter - Colorado Archaeological Society

As an advisory-nominating committee--made up of C.A.S./ Lyons members Cleo Barnes, Louise Derr, David Davis and Peter Christensen--we propose that the officers of C.A.S./Lyons, and the duties and responsibilities of these positions, be as follows:

### I. President:

- a) oversees and co-ordinates all Lyons C.A.S. meetings and activities; coordinates all C.A.S. related functions
- b) attends quarterly and yearly C.A.S. meetings
- c) appoints members to fill all vacant positions until a meeting of Quorum can vote on the matter

# II. Vice-President

- a) responsible for all treasury activities and monthly treasury report
- b) responsible for signing blue sheets during classes and surveys in order to generate C.A.S. money
- c) backs up the President in all his duties

# III. Secretary

- a) secretary of all C.A.S./Lyons meetings and activities (take notes)
- b) is editor and publishes a monthly newsletter(mailing a newsletter to all chapter members)

IV. Publicity Chairperson

a) in charge of publicity; publicizes meetings and activities to the public at large and the local media

# V. Librarian

- in charge of library; is responsible for checking out books to members
- b) responsible for the maintenance of the C.A.S./Lyons site file survey reports
- c) arranges P.A.A.C. class schedule with instructor

# VI. Speaker Coordinator

- a) organizes meetings and activities
- b) arranges speakers, meeting places for speakers and informs the editor of the newsletter in a timely fashion so as to facilitate the publication of the aforesaid information
- c) informs Bobbi Klausing, chairperson of Colorado Archaeological Awareness Year, of the speakers and topics discussed at chapter meetings so that she may include this information in state-wide newsletters (for 1983 only)

# VII. Field Director

- a) locates and organizes sites to be surveyed
- b) should have experience and skill in conducting site surveys
- c) responsible for maintenance and distribution of all survey equipment

We would like to know if you are interested in being nominated for one or more of these positions; or if you wish to nominate someone who you feel is qualified for any of these positions.

If you would like to become involved-but don't feel that you have enough time for an officer-level of commitment-there will be committees requiring volunteer support under the Field Director, the Newsletter Editor and the Speaker Coordinator.
