COMING EVENTS - ANN HAYES, VICE PRESIDENT

Indian Peaks Hosts Malville at CU Museum on April 3 at 7:00 PM. The chapter will join with the University of Colorado Museum in hosting a lecture by J. McKim Malville, "Ancient Astronomy in India and American Southwest". You will find out how two contemporary but significantly different cultures, living an earth-diameter apart, used observational astronomy to establish order and meaning in their lives. The lecture takes place in the newly refurbished Gallery Room of the museum, which presently has an exhibit of photographs and artifacts from the Yellow Jacket Site in Southern Colorado. McKim Malville, author of Prehistoric Astronomy in the Southwest and many other published works, is a professor in the Department of Astro-geophysics at CU. The lecture and slide presentation begins at 7 PM. Refreshments, provided by CAS members, will be served. Parking is available in the Museum lot on a first come first served basis.

INDIAN PEAKS EDUCATIONAL FIELD TRIPS - PLANNING STAGE.

Mancos Canyon Cultural History - Memorial Day WE, May 24/28. Scenically beautiful Mancos Canyon, adjacent to the Mesa Verde, contains pristine archaeological sites, splendid rock art, and relics of 19th century explorations by the Hayden Expeditions, the pioneering Wetherill family, and other early explorers of the Southwest. It is now the Ute Mountain Ute Tribal Park. The 4 day program includes two days (5/25 and 5/26) of light hiking to easily accessible sites in Mancos canyon, and two days of more rugged hiking (5/27 and 5/28) to view ruins and hunt for historic signatures in remote "off trail" places.

Guides for various parts of the outing include Doug Bowman, Fred Blackman, and Ute Mountain Ute guides.

There will be group camping in Ute Tribal Park where we return each evening. You bring the food. Cooking groups can be arranged. Guide fees will be about \$25 per day. You may choose which days you wish to participate, however group size will be limited on days 3 and 4.
