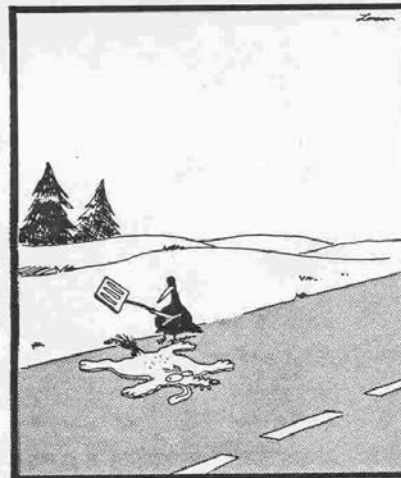
The 6th annual CAS Encampment will be held July 5-7 near Pagosa Springs, with a tour of the Chimney Rock archaeological site.

On May 18, the Chapter will sponsor a survey of a historical site on Boulder City Open Space land. The McGilvary cabin site will be recorded and mapped as part of the cooperation between the Chapter and Boulder City/County Open Space. The survey party will meet at the Open Space Operations Center, 1405 S. Broadway at 9:30 a.m. Bring a lunch and some worm clothing.

On Saturday, June 8, the Chapter will survey the Stockton Cabin site not far from the McGilvary site beginning at 9:30 a.m., and on Saturday, June 15, there will be a survey of the Parson's Ranch rock alignment. Chris Zeir will report on findings of archaeological studies at Ft Carson, south of Denver. Radiocarbon dates obtained by the firm indicate that the area was occupied from 600 to 1000 BP. Zeir will show slides of artifacts recovered from Recon John, and Gooseberry shelters, and Avery Ranch and Ocean Vista sites in the Turkey Creek drainage.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN SEMINARS

Two seminars of interest are being offered by the Rocky Mountain Nature Association at Rocky Mountain National Park. Both seminars are taught by Michael S. Burney. The following descriptions are from the 1991 seminars bulletin.

The American Indian and Rocky Mountain National Park. July 6 or August 18. \$40. Discover the cultural development and diversity of American Indians utilizing the Park since the Ice Age and continuing into the time of white contact during the late 1500's and early 1600's. A slide presentation, a visit to the park's artifact collections, a field trip, and informal discussions will be included in this **one day course**. A selected archaeological site will be observed.

Rocky Mountain Archaeology. June 14-16, \$80. Human Activity extends back over 10,000 years. Examine traces left by the earliest Paleo-Indian hunters. The Park's prehistory is the focus of this archaeological seminar. Visits to archaeological sites in and around the Park highlight this course.

Michael S. Burney is president of Western Archaeological Consultants, Inc., an archaeological and historical consulting firm, and has conducted dozens of archaeological surveys throughout the West since 1975. Currently, Michael is conducting numerous archaeological and historical studies in Colorado, Oregon, and southern California. In addition, he continues to work closely with Umatilla, Cayuse and Walla Walla Indian tribes of northeastern Oregon in furthering the tribes' interest in preserving their heritage and better defining their conservation and management of archaeological and cultural resources.
