



# Explore Ruins at Chaco and Aztec with Florence Lister

Dates: September 19-23 (Thursday - Monday)

Includes two travel days (19 & 23) to and from Boulder; three days with Florence Lister

two days (20-21) touring Chaco one day (22) at Aztec

We will see Pueblo Bonito, Chetro Ketl, Casa Rinconada, Penasco Blanco, Pueblo del Arroyo, the Wetherill graves, Yellow House, and the ruins at Aztec National Monument.

Florence C. Lister, who will be guiding our trip, has as deep a knowledge of the civilizations of the American Southwest, as anyone alive today. For over half a century, she shared fully in the researches of her archaeologist husband, the late Robert H. Lister, at Mesa Verde, Chaco, and Aztec, as well as in Arizona, Utah, Mexico, Latin America, Europe, the Canary Islands, and Africa. A scholar in her own right, Florence is the author of many publications on Anasazi and Spanish Colonial ceramics. She co-authored numerous works with Robert Lister, including books on Chaco and Aztec, which are part of her suggested reading list for this trip.

For those interested in the lore of the Wetherills, this trip is a "must."

The Indian Peaks Executive Board met Wednesday, June 26, at the Nature Center. Present were: Rick Lippincott, Steve Montgomery, Anita McHugh, Sue Lippincott, Laura Viola, and Edna Devai-Alth.

NEWSLETTER: The Board was notified by Jeannie Hamilton that printing costs for the Calumet are being increased from \$24 to \$32 per issue. The Board accepted the cost increase.

PAAC: The Board approved a new fee structure for all Chapter-sponsored PAAC classes. The new fees are \$11 for CAS members, and \$15 for non-members.

FIELD WORK: The Stockton Cabin survey has been rescheduled for Saturday, July 20 at 8:30 a.m. We will meet at the Open Space Headquarters, 1405 South Foothills Highway (South Broadway).

Continuing work on the Parson Ranch rock alignment is scheduled for 8:30 a.m. Saturday, July 13. Meet at the Parson Ranch parking lot on old North Broadway, off U.S. 36.

The Chapter's application for a grant from a major aerospace firm is now under consideration by the firm. The grant request, \$18,000, is to complete the Rock Creek Site (5BL2712) erosional excavation.

The Board approved a plan of cooperation with the U.S. Forest Service's Boulder District, to provide experienced avocational archaeologists to render assistance in the preservation and management of cultural resources in the district. Steve Montgomery met with representatives of the Forest Service after problems with known site mitigations were reported to the Chapter.

## Kind Leads High Altitude Hike to Fourth of July Sites

Attention you mountain goats, llamas, and alpacas (Ah'l packa de light stuff and you packa de other staff: sorry, Jean!).

Jean Kindig is going to scamper (lead an expedition) ((she calls it a hike, but so did my CPO in Boot Camp)) up to the Fourth of July Valley sites on Arapahoe Pass on Saturday, September 14. She is extending an invitation to the hardy (and foolhardy) to join her in this stroll through the timber and talus to see a truly exciting archaeological area that was excavated by Dr. James Benedict in 1971-75.

The hike starts at Fourth of July Park parking area, up the Arapahoe Pass trail for two miles, then two miles into the Fourth of July Valley to the sites along Middle Boulder Creek. This is the most beautiful valley in the Arapahoe Peaks.

The trip is eight miles round trip, to an altitude of 11,500 feet. The topos for the expedition are East Portal and Monarch Lake. Meet at the intersection of Pearl and Canyon Blvd. at 7 a.m. and the group will car pool to the Forth of July Park. Good hiking boots are a must for this one!
