WEST WHITE ROCKS

Bill Maxson, Edna Devai and others have been working on this site to record the rock inscriptions. Since Bill moved to Montana, he could not finish the recording and asked Jean to assume the task. Jean now has the file with sketch maps, topo maps and forms.

Permission was requested of Ricky Weiser, landowner of the west 1/2 mile of the White Rocks, to continue the recording. She was helpful and pleased to know it would be completed. Her son provided Jean with a computer generated map of the cliffs and creek.

On Nov 13, Janet Lever and Jean Kindig walked the White Rock with Rickey Weiser. It is a working ranch and a nature preserve and Weiser has restrictions for anyone entering the area. Janet traced the two prehistoric figures and Jean did a quick field sketch of the initials and names from the west ranch gate to the Prehistoric Panel, a distance of perhaps 500 meters.

WALKER PANEL

A Panel "J.D. Walker, 1883" is etched into the sandstone cliffs in Section 17 or 18 towards the east end of the White rocks. It's unclear if this panel has been recorded. It is significant since the "Walker Ranch" now belongs to Boulder County Open Space and is a well known destination in the mountains west of Boulder.

The White Rocks in this section are part of City of Boulder Open Space and permission to access has been granted by the City Ranger in charge of cultural resources, Brent Wheeler. Jean has two bright yellow cards that say **RESEARCH**.

5BL883 SIGNATURE ROCK

This site has been recorded, but the rock inscriptions need to be traced and photographed. The access to this site is from the City of Boulder White Rocks Trail near 95th Street.

The recording will be done with a combination of photography, tracing and field sketching. We need a "dedicated team" of CAS volunteers for this intriguing project. Jean Kindig will be the Project Manager.
