A word from Peter Gleichman

The Hog Back complex has been defined as the local Ceramic Period manifestation oriented to the Front Range and the plains foothills transition zone. The definition is based on Benedict's research in the high country, excavations at the Rock Creek Site and other sites along the hogback, and on extensive survey data. The artifact assemblage for this complex consists of a variety of distinctive types and materials. Included are the hogback corner-notched arrowpoints and other flaked stone tools made from lithic sources in Middle Part and on the plains, grinding slabs from Lyons Sandstone, other groundstone from Boulder Grandiorite, and locally produced ceramics. Edge-ground cobbles of completely unknown function have recently been discovered to be a rather unique and mysterious part of this assemblage. In the last several years Native Cultural Services has surveyed over 30,000 acres in Boulder County. A summary of this research will be given along with a summary of the 1994 C.U.
