## **Christmas Party**

#### July, August, September


Sometime during these months we plan to arrange trips to the Windsor Buffalo Kill and Willow Bunker excavation sites.

After the discussion, we toured the exterior of the cabin.





#### Amazon.com

IPCAS has been approved as an amazon.com associate. What does that mean? We can receive 5% - 15% of all book sales that are initiated from amazon.com links on our IPCAS web-site. We can make money for our club three ways:

#### Restrictions

#### September Board of Director's meeting

Meeting called to order at 7:30 in Sword Microsystems Conference Room. Attendees: Morrell, Cree, Minturn, Holien, Damon, Stinson (Morey and Janet), Miller

Secretary's report (Damon): none available; first meeting after summer hiatus

Treasurer's report (Owens): not available

Vice President's report (Morrell): There are a couple of open slots for speakers at the monthly chapter meetings for the next year. CAS annual meeting will be held in Glenwood Springs on October 2 and 3. Revised CAS by-laws have been provided to the Chapter and must be available to all members upon request. We will announce the availability of these by-laws at the September chapter meeting and also publish them in the Calumet. Museum rent has been increased for IPCAS monthly chapter meetings. We will continue to hold monthly meetings at the museum in spite of the increase. A copy of a video-tape about Vogel canyon has been provided to IPCAS from the Colorado Springs chapter. The board agreed to show this tape at the annual Christmas Party, which will be held at the museum during the time slot for the regular monthly chapter meeting.

**Unfinished Business**: T-shirts to go to print on September 23 and should be available at next chapter meeting. A recommendation had been made previously that we have a monthly activity or outing for members. After discussion as to whether or not to pursue, Minturn volunteered to make some calls to a couple of suggested destinations to see whether trips would be feasible. Our Rock Art workshop is cancelled since Janet Lever is no longer available.

New Business: There are about 16 members receiving electronic distribution of the Calumet. There has been some difficulty in transmitting pictures, but Cindy and Tom will resolve the issue. The Willow Bunker outing is still scheduled for October 9th and 10th, with a backup date of the 16th and 17th in case of inclement weather. Next PAAC class is "Colorado Archaeology" and will begin on October 13th at the Foothills Nature Center. Elections for offices and board representatives will be at the November meeting. We need to find members willing to take on the positions for President and Treasurer at least, and open up other positions if volunteers are available. The nominating committee includes Morrell, Janet Stinson, and Cindy Miller. Meeting adjourned at 9:30 PM

#### October Board of Director's meeting

Meeting called to order at 7:30 in Community Room of Horizon West - Attendees: Morrell, Cree, Minturn, Smith, Damon, Shay, and Gleichman. **Secretary's report** (Damon): read minutes from September meeting; minutes approved by board

Treasurer's report (Owens): Current bank balance: \$1371.41; income from June to October was \$636.25 and expenses were \$711.40.

Vice President's report (Morrell): All speaker slots are now filled for the monthly Chapter meetings.

**Unfinished business**: White Rocks report cannot be made available on the web-site. There may be some White Rocks related activity for the chapter to pursue if we desire, in lieu of ongoing monitoring of the inscriptions at the site for weathering, etc. In previous board meetings, the board discussed the possibility of sharing class activity related to the chapter PAAC classes on the web-site. After conversing with Kevin Black, it sounds like there would be some opportunity to publish pictures of class activity, but limited opportunity to show slides, etc that are currently used in the classes since they belong to the state. Regarding the Magnolia survey: Morrell will call the home-owner's association to see if they are still interested in IPCAS participation in surveying the area. The board is still working on the nominations for IPCAS officers: elections will be held at the November chapter meeting. Still need volunteers to serve on the board and as officers.


