

Book Review

The Indian Tipi - its history, construction, and use Reginald and Gladys Laubin

This is an old book, in light of today's continuous advances in archaeological technique. The first edition was published in 1957 and a revised, second edition was published in 1977. But the information contained within the covers is timeless.

The Laubins had their own tipi and 25-foot poles, which they carried on top of their car, a coupe (you have to see the photograph to believe it). They visited many Native American gatherings each year and became good friends with many of the tribes that they met. They would collect verbal histories, including the philosophy and use of the tipi.

Their book contains descriptions of not just a tipi, but of the various sizes and shapes used by different tribes. The details of tipi use include all interior furnishings and decorations. How people used, transported, and erected the tipi is provided in great detail. After reading the book, I was ready to obtain my own tipi, confident that I could construct, transport, erect, and live in it.

The Laubins provide fascinating stories that tell about Native American life and customs. They were 'adopted' by tribal members and told legends and stories that were not usually available to outsiders. Some of that cultural information is contained in the book.

If you have ever wondered about the how and why of the tipi, read this book. It is an easy, interesting book to read - and great photographs and illustrations.
