January 12 IPCAS Presentation Meeting, 7PM, Marcy Riser of the US Forest service. Topic: TBD The Stories Trees Tell: Dendroarchaeology and Culturally Modified Trees in Northern Colorado and Wyoming.

Marcy Reiser is an archaeologist with the Arapaho & Roosevelt National Forests and Pawnee National Grasslands. Reiser, who grew up in Denver, received her Master's degree from Colorado State University in 2010. Her thesis research, which was conducted in Wyoming's Bighorn Basin, compared tree-ring data from historic cabins and culturally modified trees to historic documents from the area. She has since expanded her research to other parts of Wyoming and Colorado.

Reiser will present her thesis research as well as similar research she is conducting in the Rocky Mountain region. As we all witness the impact of the mountain pine beetle and other stresses on our forests, the identification and collection of archaeological wood in these forests could not be more urgent. Reiser will describe the collaborative and concerted efforts being made to document the most endangered of these resources.

PAAC Lab Training

Every winter Kevin Black from the Office of Archaeology and Historic preservation offers lab training sessions. Trainees work with Kevin to analyze and catalog artifacts. You can use your lab time towards Certified
Laboratory Trainee or other PAAC certifications (Click here for more on Certification Requirements). However, if you can make it, the best way to start out is to take the PAAC Lab Techniques class.

This winter, we will be holding lab days in a different building from years past, in an off-site storage facility in central Denver very easily accessed from both the interstate highways. A packet of information with additional details, including a location map, will be sent to all participants. There will be 16 total lab days this season, eight dates each in December and January as follows:

Monday, January 9 Tuesday, January 10 Friday, January 13 Saturday, January 14 Tuesday, January 17 Wednesday, January 18 Wednesday, January 25 Thursday, January 26

Denver Lab Project

- 1. The Office of Archaeology and Historic Preservation (OAHP) has archaeological collections that have yet to be completely processed for permanent curation. PAAC volunteers may receive credit toward certification at either the Laboratory Trainee or Laboratory Technician level by helping the State Training Coordinator in the cataloging and analysis of these materials.
- 2. The lab work is held at History Colorado's off-site facility in central Denver, on intermittent days in January, 8:30 am-4:30 pm. The lab training for 2012 will be conducted on the following dates: January 9, 10, 13, 14, 17, 18, 25, & 26, 2012. Prospective volunteers should contact the State Training Coordinator to participate, and identify on which days they wish to attend. All supervised hours spent with specific materials in the collections apply toward the 40 hours of lab time required for certification. While the collection includes a variety of prehistoric and historical materials, a large majority is lithic (flaked stone and ground stone artifacts).


3. Prerequisite Courses:

No prior experience is required in most instances. However, lab space and equipment for volunteers is limited, so if too many PAAC participants wish to volunteer on a scheduled lab day, preference will be given to those volunteers who have already earned the Lab Trainee certificate and are working toward the Lab Technician certificate, and others who have completed one or more of the following courses:

- a. Introduction to Archaeology, CAS & PAAC
- b. Introduction to Laboratory Techniques
- c. Prehistoric Lithics Description and Analysis

4. Requirements:
