# **September Topic:**

On Top of the Great Divide: Archaeology of the Rollins Pass Area Dr. Jason LaBelle

The presentation will review our on-going survey project on Rollins Pass, situated on the Continental Divide separating Boulder, Gilpin, and Grand Counties. The archaeological potential of Rollins Pass has been known since the late 19th century, but earnest scientific efforts began in the late 1960s, with the pioneering work of the late Byron Olson and Jim Benedict. They recorded 39 sites on the Pass, including camp sites, processing locales, and large game drives, with several sites test excavated and dated. Several years ago, those collections and paper records were transferred to CSU for analysis. Since 2009, volunteers and archaeologists from Colorado State University have been revisiting these known sites, re-recording them, and discovering new sites in the sub-alpine and alpine tundra. The radiocarbon chronology now extends back over 3000 years, with diagnostic artifacts dating back even further to Late Paleoindian times. The game drives of Rollins Pass, in particular, have yielded new evidence relating to bighorn sheep hunting along the Colorado Front Range.

Dr. Jason LaBelle is an Associate Professor specializing in the archaeology of ancient Native American peoples. He received his BA in Anthropology from Colorado State University (1995) and his MA (2000) and Ph.D. (2005) in Anthropology from Southern Methodist University. He serves as the Director of the Center for Mountain and Plains Archaeology, aimed at understanding the relationships between umans and the varied ecological landscapes of northern Colorado and southern Wyoming. Specific research interests include grassland/foothills/mountain ecology, playa lakes, hunter-gatherer site structure, earth cooking strategies, lithic technology, and the history of archaeology. LaBelle's past fieldwork has taken him across Colorado, Nebraska, Oklahoma, Montana, New Mexico, Texas, and Wyoming. His research has been published in journals such as American Antiquity, Archaeometry, Current Research in the Pleistocene, Geoarchaeology, Plains Anthropologist, in addition to book chapters and technical reports in the academic and contract realms. He was bestowed the honor of "Best Teacher in the College of Liberal Arts", awarded for his work with undergraduate and graduate students. He is currently on the Board of Directors for the Plains Anthropological Society and is past President of the Colorado Archaeological Society (1000+ members). Dr. LaBelle runs an active public outreach program, with public talks and tours each year. He was honored with a "Distinction in Advancement" award, in recognition of this public service. In addition to teaching and research, he serves as the Curator of the Archaeological Repository at Colorado State University.

# Report on the Reconnaissance and Survey at the Alonzo Allen Cabin Site

"I think that the Alonzo Allen Cabin Project was a great opportunity for all of us involved to participate in a short-term Historical Archaeology project, thanks to Dr. Brunswig. For me, the most important moment was when, after comparing the fireplace with photos from the 1920's and 30's, it was obvious that we were dealing with an in situ feature rather than a reconstructed fireplace from the 1930's." Volunteers excavated and surveyed at the Alonzo Allen Cabin Site near Allenspark on the weekend of August 18 & 19, 2012 under the direction of Dr Bob Brunswig.

Alonzo Allen, arrived in Colorado May 1, 1859. He was a prospector and rancher and built the first cabin in the area that became Longmont. In 1864, he built a cabin east of what became his namesake, Allenspark. He used that cabin for shelter when mining and running cattle; apparently it was never his permanent residence.

In 2012, the only visible evidence of the Alonzo Allen cabin was the fireplace. We did three excavation pits around the fireplace and a fourth where metal detectors indicated a large metal cache. Artifacts found included a civil war era military button and prospecting equipment. Evaluation of the fireplace indicated that it was the original fireplace and not reconstructed. We hope to do more excavation next season.
